Class Descriptions

Dance for Theatre: K-12

Explores traditional Broadway and contemporary styles in an exciting, energetic atmosphere. Students learn fundamental steps and basic vocabulary through across the floor exercises and fun combinations.

Students will Learn:

- Problem solving techniques
- Motor skills
- Math, counting, and rhythm
- How to begin, follow through, and complete a task
- Confidence, grace, awareness, and self-esteem

Broadway Bound: Grades 2nd-6th

An introduction to musical theatre. Students will learn the basics of singing; vocal warm ups, breath control, and projection, while learning choreography from Broadway musicals and movies. Class culminates in a performance of staged musical numbers.

Students will Learn:

- Diction and memorization
- Self-confidence among peers
- How to be a part of a team
- Problem solving techniques
- Collaborative skills
- Performance skills

Footlights: K-4th

An introduction to drama. Learn how the theatre world comes alive in an exciting class that introduces all the different aspects of theatre to the young student. Each class will focus on a *specific theatrical discipline, such as costumes, makeup, lights, and sound, all while adding components of scene work.

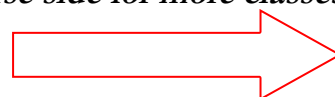
Students will Learn:

Class Descriptions

Acting: Grades 6th-12th

Students will learn basic acting techniques while performing in “page-to-stage” adaptations of historical drama. This class will teach the tools an actor needs as they pursue objectives, character choices, focus and stage presence.

Students will Learn:

- How to cite textual evidence
- How to identify central themes
- How to explain plot and character development
- How to discover subtext
- Adaptability and flexibility

**Common Core English Language Arts Standards*

Playwriting: Grades 3rd-6th

Imagination, thoughts and dreams let young playwrights discover their inner voice. This class explores different themes and styles of plays. Students will create their own works and perform in each other’s created plays, culminating in a final staged reading.

Students will Learn:

- How to ask and answer questions about key details
- How to describe characters, settings, and major events
- How to retell stories
- Improvisation

**Common Core English Language Arts Standards*

Stories & Music: K-2nd

A fun class that will take popular children’s literature and music to help build the student’s imagination, confidence, and creativity. Class will incorporate storytelling and improvisation. This is a great class for youngsters that encourages literacy, laughter, and teamwork.

Students will Learn:

- About theatre and music around the world, such as Kabuki and Commedia Dell’Arte
- How to connect and apply global theatre, facilitating social diversity

**Visual & Performing Arts Theatre Content Standards*

Classes are specifically designed to accommodate either a 4 or 8-week session. Pricing is subject to number of students and length of session.

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
